

2020 Statistics on Returned Farmers & Fishermen and Migrators to Rural Regions


1. Returned Farmers

☐ (Returned farmer households)

The number of returned farmer households was 12,489 households in 2020, which grew by 1,067 households (9.3%) from 2019.

- O The average returned farmer household size stood at 1.40 persons in 2020, down 0.02 person compared to 2019.
 - * Year-on-year percent change in returned farmer households (%): (2016) 7.7 \rightarrow (2017) \triangle 1.9 \rightarrow (2018) \triangle 5.3 \rightarrow (2019) \triangle 4.5 \rightarrow (2020) 9.3

<Returned farmer households and average household size>




☐ (Characteristics of returned farmer household heads)

Males accounted for 67.9% of the total returned farmer household heads. The average age of returned farmer household heads stood at 55.3 years in 2020.

O As for returned farmer household heads by age group, heads aged '50~59' and '60~69' occupied 35.0% and 32.5%, respectively. These two age groups took up 67.5% of the total returned farmer household heads.

<Composition of returned farmer household heads by age group>




☐ (Characteristics of returned farmer households)

1-person households took up 74.1% of the total returned farmer households.

O Unmixed returned farmer households, in other words, households consisting of only returned farmer household members, occupied 87.2%. Whereas, mixed returned farmer households, in other words, households consisting of returned farmer household members as well as residents in rural areas, occupied 12.8%.


<Composition of returned farmer households by household size>



☐ (Size of returned farmer household members)

Returned farmer household members recorded 17,447 persons in 2020, increasing by 1,266 persons (7.8%) from 2019.

O Returned farmers totaled 12,570 persons in 2020, rising by 1,066 persons (9.3%) from 11,504 persons in 2019. Their household members totaled 4,877 persons in 2020, rising by 200 persons (4.3%) from 2019.



Full-time returned farmers amounted to 8,625 persons, which occupied 68.6% of the total returned farmers. In the meantime, part-time returned farmers amounted to 3,945 persons, which occupied 31.4% of the total returned farmers.



<Composition of returned farmers by type>


2. Returned Fishermen

☐ (Returned fisherman households)

The number of returned fisherman households was 897 households in 2020, which fell by 7 households ($\triangle 0.8\%$) from 904 households in 2019.

- O The average returned fisherman household size was 1.33 persons in 2020, down 0.04 person compared to 1.37 persons in 2019.
 - * Year-on-year percent change in returned fisherman households (%): (2016) \triangle 6.3 \rightarrow (2017) \triangle 2.5 \rightarrow (2018) 1.2 \rightarrow (2019) \triangle 1.4 \rightarrow (2020) \triangle 0.8

<Returned fisherman households and average returned fisherman household size>




☐ (Characteristics of returned fisherman household heads)

Males accounted for 68.8% of the total returned fisherman household heads. The average age of returned fisherman household heads stood at 52.8 years in 2020.

O As for returned fisherman household heads by age group, heads aged '50~59' and '60~69' occupied 35.7% and 25.1%, respectively. These two age groups took up 60.8% of the total returned fisherman household heads.


<Composition of returned fisherman household heads by age group>




☐ (Characteristics of returned fisherman households)

1-person households took up 77.6% of the total returned fisherman households.

O Unmixed returned fisherman households, in other words, households consisting of only returned fisherman household members, occupied 75.1%. Whereas, mixed returned fisherman households, in other words, households consisting of returned fisherman household members as well as residents in fishing villages, occupied 24.9%.






☐ (Size of returned fisherman household members)

Returned fishermen and their household members totaled 1,197 persons in 2020, dropping by 37 persons ($\triangle 3.0\%$) compared to 1,234 persons in 2019.


O Returned fishermen totaled 967 persons in 2020, rising 8 persons (0.8%) from 959 persons in 2019. Their household members totaled 230 persons in 2020, falling 45 persons (\triangle 16.4%) from 2019.

(Returned fishermen by type)

Full-time returned fishermen amounted to 651 persons, which occupied 67.3% of the total returned fishermen. In the meantime, part-time returned fishermen amounted to 316 persons, which occupied 32.7% of the total returned fishermen.




<Composition of returned fishermen by type>

3. Migrators to Rural Regions

☐ (Migrant households to rural regions)

The number of migrant households to rural regions was 345,205 households in 2020, which rose by 27,545 households (8.7%) from 317,660 households in 2019.

- O The average migrant household size was 1.38 persons in 2020, falling by 0.02 person from 1.40 persons in 2019.
 - * Year-on-year percent change in migrant households to rural regions (%): (2016) 1.6 \rightarrow (2017) 3.6 \rightarrow (2018) \triangle 1.7 \rightarrow (2019) \triangle 3.3 \rightarrow (2020) 8.7
 - <Migrant households to rural regions and average migrant household size>




☐ (Characteristics of migrant household heads)

Males accounted for 60.9% of the total migrant household heads. The average age of migrant household heads stood at 45.1 years in 2020.

O As for migrators to rural regions by age group, heads aged '30~39', '29 or less' and '50~59' occupied 22.6%, 20.7% and 18.4%, respectively.






☐ (Characteristics of migrant households)

1-person households occupied 74.7% of the total migrant households to rural areas.

O Unmixed migrant households to rural regions, in other words, households consisting of only migrant household members, occupied 72.5%. Whereas, mixed migrant households, in other words, households consisting of migrant household members as well as residents in rural areas and fishing villages, occupied 27.5%.


<Composition of migrant households by household size>



☐ (Size of migrant household members)

The number of migrators to rural regions recorded 477,122 persons in 2020, increasing by 32,658 persons (7.3%) from 2019.

O The average age of migrators to rural regions stood at 42.2 years in 2020. Migrators to rural regions aged 29 or less occupied the largest share at 26.3%, which was followed by those aged 30~39 (21.6%) and those aged 50~59 (16.8%).

As for residence region before migration, Gyeonggi recorded the highest figure of 121,792 persons (25.5%), which was followed by Seoul (68,849 persons, 14.4%) and Gyeongnam (34,821 persons, 7.3%). Migrants from Seoul Capital Area (Seoul, Incheon and Gyeonggi) accounted for 44.2%.
