


Preliminary Results of 2018 Census on Establishments


1 Number of establishments and workers

- As of the end of 2018, the number of establishments was 4.10 million entities, which increased by 80 thousand entities (2.1%) from a year ago. The number of workers was 22.20 million persons, which rose by 570 thousand persons (2.6%) from a year ago.
 - Compared to a decade ago, the number of establishments went up by 840 thousand entities (25.7%) and the number of workers grew by 5.91 million persons (36.3%). For the past decade, these two figures showed a continuously increasing trend.




2 Change in the number of establishments and workers by industry

- As for establishments by industry, 'Accommodation and Food Service Activities' (19 thousand establishments) recorded the highest year-on-year increase, which was followed by 'Transportation and Storage' (13 thousand establishments) and 'Membership Organizations, Repair and Other Personal Service' (10 thousand establishments).
- As for workers by industry, 'Accommodation and Food Service Activities' and 'Professional, Scientific and Technical Activities' increased by 95 thousand persons and 73 thousand persons, respectively.



1 Number of establishments and workers

- ☐ Compared to the previous year, the number of establishments and workers grew by 2.1% and 2.6%, respectively.
- ☐ For the past decade, the number of establishments and workers showed an ever-increasing trend.
- As of the end of 2018, the number of establishments was 4.10 million entities, which increased by 2.1% (80 thousand entities) from a year ago. The number of workers was 22.20 million persons, which rose by 2.6% (570 thousand persons) from a year ago.
- Ocompared to a decade ago, the number of establishments went up by 25.7% (840 thousand entities). The number of workers grew by 36.3% (5.91 million persons) from 2008. For the past decade, these two figures showed a continuously increasing trend.
 - For the past decade (2008~2018), the number of establishments and workers grew by 2.3% and 3.1%, respectively, on an annual average.



< Number of establishments and workers by year >



2 Number of establishments by industry

☐ All industries excluding 'Mining and Quarrying' recorded an increase in establishments.

- Ocompared to the previous year, the number of establishments increased by 80 thousand entities.
- Ocompared to the previous year, as for establishments by industry, 'Accommodation and Food Service Activities' recorded the highest increase (19 thousand entities, 2.5%), which was followed by 'Transportation and Storage' (13 thousand entities, 3.4%) and 'Membership Organizations, Repair and Other Personal Services' (10 thousand entities, 2.5%). In the meantime, 'Mining and Quarrying' decreased by 84 entities (-4.2%).

< Change and percent change in the number of establishments by industry >





3 Number of workers by industry

- ☐ All industries excluding 'Financial and Insurance Activities' and 'Mining and Quarrying' recorded an increase in workers.
- O Compared to the previous year, the number of workers increased by 570 thousand persons.
- Compared to the previous year, as for workers by industry, 'Accommodation and Food Service Activities' (95 thousand persons, 4.3%), 'Human Health and Social Work Activities' (87 thousand persons, 4.9%) and 'Professional, Scientific and Technical Activities' (73 thousand persons, 7.2%) marked an increase. Whereas, 'Financial and Insurance Activities' (-16 thousand persons, -2.1%) marked a decrease.

< Change and percent change in the number of workers by industry >







4 Number of establishments and workers by type of legal organization

- ☐ Compared to the previous year, individual proprietorships recorded an increase (50 thousand entities) in establishments. incorporated companies recorded an increase (280 thousand persons) in workers.
- Ocompared to the previous year, as for establishments by type of legal organization, individual proprietorships (50 thousand entities, 1.6%) recorded the highest increase, which was followed by incorporated companies (27 thousand entities, 4.8%).
- Ocompared to the previous year, as for workers by type of legal organization, incorporated companies (278 thousand persons, 2.9%) recorded the highest increase, which was followed by individual proprietorships (121 thousand persons, 1.5%) and non-business corporations (119 thousand persons, 3.7%).





5 Number of establishments and workers by size of workers

- \square Compared to the previous year, establishments with 1 ~ 4 workers recorded an increase (50 thousand entities) in establishments. Establishments with 5 ~ 99 workers recorded an increase (420 thousand persons) in workers.
- Ocompared to the previous year, as for establishments by size of workers, establishments with $1 \sim 4$ workers (47 thousand entities, 1.5%) recorded the highest increase, which was followed by establishments with $5 \sim 99$ workers (35 thousand entities, 4.6%).
- Compared to the previous year, as for workers by size of workers, establishments with 5 ~ 99 workers (421 thousand persons, 4.1%) recorded the highest increase, which was followed by establishments with 300 workers or more (103 thousand persons, 3.3%).



6 Number of workers by status of workers

☐ As for workers by status of workers, regular workers showed the highest increase.

- Ocompared to the previous year, as for workers by status of workers, regular workers recorded the highest increase (420 thousand persons, 3.0%), which was followed by temporary and daily workers (109 thousand persons, 3.9%) and self-employed and unpaid family workers (59 thousand persons, 1.5%).
 - Other workers decreased by 19 thousand persons (-2.0%) from 2017.



Number of establishments by age group of CEOs

- ☐ Establishments with a CEO aged 50 ~ 59 occupied the largest share. Compared to the previous year, establishments with a CEO aged 60 or more recorded the highest increase.
- \bigcirc As of the end of 2018, establishments with a CEO aged 50 \sim 59 occupied the largest share at 34.5%, which was followed by establishments with a CEO aged 40 \sim 49 (27.6%) and establishments with a CEO aged 60 or more (22.6%).

○ As for the year-on-year percent change in establishments by age group of CEOs, establishments with a CEO aged 60 or more recorded the highest increase (56 thousand entities, 6.4%), which was followed by establishments with a CEO aged 50 ~ 59 (18 thousand entities, 1.3%) and establishments with a CEO aged 30 ~ 39 (4 thousand entities, 0.8%).

Number of establishments with a female CEO by industry

- ☐ 'Accommodation and Food Service Activities' and 'Education' showed a higher share of female CEOs compared to the average of all industries.
- ☐ Compared to the previous year, the female CEOs recorded a rise in 'Membership Organizations, Repair and Other Personal Services', 'Accommodation and Food Service Activities' and 'Wholesale and Retail Trade'.
- As of the end of 2018, 'Accommodation and Food Service Activities' (60.7%), 'Education' (56.5%) and 'Membership Organizations, Repair and Other Personal Services' (48.0%) showed a higher share of female CEOs compared to the average of all industries (38.4%).
- As for establishments with a female CEO, 'Membership Organizations, Repair and Other Personal Services' recorded the highest year-on-year increase (8 thousand entities, 4.0%), which was followed by 'Accommodation and Food Service Activities' (7 thousand entities, 1.5%) and 'Wholesale and Retail Trade' (4 thousand entities, 1.1%) compared to the previous year.

O As of the end of 2018, female workers recorded 9.61 million persons, which rose by 3.2% (293 thousand persons) from the previous year. Male workers recorded 12.59 million persons, which rose by 22% (275 thousand persons) from the previous year.



- ☐ Compared to the previous year, Gyeonggi recorded the highest increase in establishments, which was followed by Gyeongnam and Chungnam.
- Ocompared to the previous year, Gyeonggi recorded the highest increase (31 thousand entities, 3.5%), which was followed by Gyeongnam (7 thousand entities, 2.6%), Chungnam (6 thousand entities, 3.6%), Gyeongbuk (6 thousand entities, 2.6%) and Incheon (6 thousand entities, 2.9%).
 - < Change and percent change in the number of establishments by region >







☐ Compared to the previous year, Gyeonggi recorded the highest increase in workers, which was followed by Seoul and Incheon.

Ocompared to the previous year, Gyeonggi recorded the highest increase (208 thousand persons, 4.2%) in workers, which was followed by Seoul (71 thousand persons, 1.4%), Incheon (35 thousand persons, 3.4%), Chungbuk (31 thousand persons, 4.6%) and Gangwon (25 thousand persons, 4.1%).
