1 Number of establishments by industry

☐ At the end of 2021, there were 6.076 million establishments, which increased by 44 thousand establishments (0.7%) from 2020.

O (All industries)

At the end of 2021, there were 6.076 million establishments, which increased by 44 thousand establishments (0.7%) from 6.032 million establishments in 2020.


- (Number of establishments by industry)
 As for the number of establishments by industrial section, 'Wholesale and retail trade' recorded the highest figure of 1.536 million establishments (25.3%), which was followed by 'Accommodation and food service activities' (863 thousand establishments, 14.2%) and 'Transportation and storage' (617 thousand establishments, 10.2%).
- (Change in establishments by industry)
 As for the year-on-year change in establishments by industrial section, 'Wholesale and retail trade' (-31 thousand establishments, -2.0%) and 'Business facilities management and business support services; rental and leasing activities' (-9 thousand establishments, -6.0%) showed a decrease. Whereas, 'Transportation and storage' (24 thousand establishments, 4.0%) and 'Electricity, gas, steam and air conditioning supply' (14 thousand establishments, 19.4%) showed an increase.





- ☐ At the end of 2021, there were 24.993 million workers, which increased by 179 thousand workers (0.7%) from 2020.
- (All industries) At the end of 2021, there were 24.993 million workers, which increased by 179 thousand persons (0.7%) from 24.813 million workers in 2020.

- (Number of workers by industry) As for the number of workers by industrial section, 'Manufacturing' recorded the highest figure of 4.23 million workers (16.9%), which was followed by 'Wholesale and retail trade' (3.69 million workers, 14.8%) and 'Human health and social work activities' (2.364 million workers, 9.5%).


(Change in workers by industry) As for the year-on-year change in workers by industrial section, 'Construction' (-158 thousand workers, -7.3%) and 'Manufacturing' (-30 thousand workers, -0.7%) showed a decrease. Whereas, 'Human health and social work activities' (114 thousand workers, 5.1%) and 'Transportation and storage' (42 thousand workers, 3.2%) showed an increase.



< Top industries occupying a high share of workers >







3 Number of establishments and workers by type of legal organization

- ☐ Compared to 2020, individual establishments recorded an increase of 33 thousand establishments. Non-company corporations recorded an increase of 155 thousand workers.
- O As for the year-on-year change in establishments by type of legal organization, company corporations (-5 thousand establishments, -0.5%) recorded a decrease. Whereas, individual establishments (33 thousand establishments, 0.7%) and non-corporate organizations (9 thousand establishments, 9.4%) recorded an increase.
- O As for the year-on-year change in workers by type of legal organization, individual establishments (-136 thousand workers, -1.5%) recorded a decrease. Whereas, non-company corporations(155 thousand workers, 3.7%) and company corporations (103 thousand workers, 0.9%) recorded an increase.




Number of establishments and workers by size of workers

- ☐ Compared to 2020, establishments with 1~4 workers recorded an increase of 33 thousand establishments. Establishments with 5~99 workers recorded an increase of 178 thousand workers.
- O As for the year-on-year change in establishments by size of workers, establishments with 100~299 workers (-139 establishments, -0.9%) and those with 300 workers or more (-45 establishments, -1.0%) recorded a decrease. In the meantime, establishments with 1~4 workers (33 thousand establishments, 0.6%) and those with 5~99 workers (11 thousand establishments, 1.4%) recorded an increase.
- O As for the year-on-year change in workers by size of workers, establishments with 300 workers or more (-18 thousand workers, -0.5%) and those with 100~299 workers (-9 thousand workers, -0.4%) recorded a decrease. In the meantime, establishments with 5~99 workers (178 thousand workers, 1.6%) and those with 1~4 workers (28 thousand workers, 0.4%) recorded an increase.




Number of workers by status of workers

 \square As for workers by status of workers, regular workers showed the highest year-on-year increase.

- O As of the end of 2021, as for the share of workers by status of workers, regular workers occupied the largest share of 64.5% of the total workers, which was followed by self-employed and unpaid family workers (21.2%) and temporary and daily workers (11.1%).
- O As for the year-on-year change in workers by status of workers, temporary and daily workers (-395 thousand workers, -12.5%) and self-employed and unpaid family workers (-84 thousand workers, -1.6%) recorded a decrease. In the meantime, regular workers(564 thousand workers, 3.6%) and other workers (94 thousand workers, 12.9%) recorded an increase.




6 Number of establishments by age group of CEOs

- ☐ Establishments with a CEO aged 50~59 occupied the largest share. Compared to 2020, establishments with a CEO aged 30~39 and those with a CEO aged 29 or less recorded an increase.
- O As of the end of 2021, establishments with a CEO aged 50~59 occupied the largest share at 32.0%, which was followed by those with a CEO aged 40~49 (26.5%) and those with a CEO aged 60 or more (23.4%).
- O As for the year-on-year change in establishments by age group of CEOs, establishments with a CEO aged 60 or more (-17 thousand establishments, -1.2%) and those with a CEO aged 50~59 (-14 thousand establishments, -0.7%) recorded a decrease. In the meantime, establishments with a CEO aged 30~39 (40 thousand establishments, 5.0%), those with a CEO aged 29 or less (27 thousand establishments, 12.1%) and those with a CEO aged 40~49 (7 thousand establishments, 0.5%) recorded an increase.

- ☐ 'Education', 'Accommodation and food service activities' and 'Membership organizations, repair and other personal services' showed a higher share of female CEOs compared to the average of all industries.
- O As of the end of 2021, 'Education' (60.3%), 'Accommodation and food service activities' (57.9%) and 'Membership organizations, repair and other personal services' (47.8%) showed a higher share of female CEOs compared to the average of all industries (36.8%).
- O As for the year-on-year change in establishments with a female CEO, 'Accommodation and food service activities' (-5 thousand establishments, -1.0%) and 'Wholesale and retail trade' (-3 thousand establishments, -0.5%) recorded a decrease. In the meantime, 'Education' (10 thousand establishments, 7.0%) and 'Electricity, gas, steam and air conditioning supply' (5 thousand establishments, 16.8%) recorded an increase.

< Number of establishments with a female CEO by industry >



- O As for the year-on-year change in establishments by region, Seoul (-24 thousand establishments, -2.0%), Daegu (-3 thousand establishments, -1.2%) and Ulsan (-2 thousand establishments, -1.6%) recorded a decrease. In the meantime, Gyeonggi (25 thousand establishments, 1.7%), Chungnam (8 thousand establishments, 3.1%) and Gyeongbuk (7 thousand establishments, 2.3%) recorded an increase.



O As for the year-on-year change in workers by region, Seoul (-53 thousand workers, -0.9%), Jeonbuk (-4 thousand workers, -0.5%) and Daejeon (-3 thousand workers, -0.4%) recorded a decrease. In the meantime, Gyeonggi (106 thousand workers, 1.8%), Gyeongnam (23 thousand workers, 1.6%) and Incheon (20 thousand workers, 1.7%) recorded an increase.
