


## Supplementary Results of the Economically Active Population Survey by Employment Type in August 2022


- ☐ In August 2022, the non-regular workers totaled 8.156 million persons, which grew by 90 thousand persons from August 2021. The non-regular workers accounted for 37.5% of the total wage workers, down 0.9%p from August 2021.
- The regular workers totaled 13.568 million persons, which rose by 641 thousand persons year-on-year.




- In the past, the Economically Active Population Survey partially identified Fixed-term Contract Workers, which has been newly added in August 2019. Therefore, 2019 and later data related to Fixed-term Contract Workers, Non-permanent Workers, Non-regular Workers and Regular Workers should not be compared to 2018 and previous data to confirm an increase or a decrease.
- The non-permanent workers marked 5.348 million persons, rising by 177 thousand persons year-on-year. The part-time workers marked 3.687 million persons, rising by 175 thousand persons year-on-year. The non-typical workers marked 2.131 million persons, dropping by 147 thousand persons year-on-year.



- As for non-regular workers by gender, the male non-regular workers totaled 3.653 million persons, which grew by 78 thousand persons. The female non-regular workers totaled 4.503 million persons. which rose by 13 thousand persons.
- As for non-regular workers by age group, the non-regular workers aged '60 or more' and '50 ~ 59' grew by 151 thousand persons and 58 thousand persons, respectively. Whereas, the non-regular workers aged '40 ~ 49' and '30 ~ 39' fell by 96 thousand persons and 33 thousand persons, respectively.
  - < Non-regular workers by gender (thousand persons) >









- As for non-regular workers by industry, 'Accommodation and food service activities', 'Human health and social work activities' and 'Manufacturing' grew by 77 thousand persons, 31 thousand persons and 29 thousand persons, respectively.
  - 'Construction', 'Business facilities management and business support services; rental and leasing activities' and 'Agriculture, forestry and fishing' fell by 45 thousand persons, 18 thousand persons and 17 thousand persons, respectively.
- As for non-regular workers by occupation, 'Service workers' and 'Plant, machine operators and assemblers' increased by 73 thousand persons and 30 thousand persons, respectively. In the meantime, 'Craft and related trades workers' decreased by 77 thousand persons.







- ☐ Year-on-year change in working conditions of non-regular workers
- 62.8% of non-regular workers chose their employment type voluntarily, which went up by 2.9%p.
  - The share of non-permanent workers, part-time workers and non-typical workers who chose their employment type voluntarily rose by 1.8%p, 2.0%p and 3.0%p, respectively.


- The average service period in the current job recorded 2 years and 6 months (30 months) in August 2022, which rose by 1 month from August 2021.
- The average employment hours recorded 29.6 hours per week, falling by 0.6 hour.
- The average monthly wage and salaries for the past three months (June ~ August) marked 1.881 million won, which increased by 112 thousand won.
  - When excluding part-time workers, the average monthly wages and salaries stood at 2.61 million won, increasing by 183 thousand won.





- The share of non-regular workers joining an employment insurance stood at 54.0%, up 1.4%p year-on-year. The share of non-regular workers joining a health insurance marked 51.7%, up 1.4%p year-on-year. Whereas, the share of non-regular workers joining a national pension stood at 38.3%, down 0.1%p year-on-year.
  - The share of non-typical workers joining an employment insurance and a health insurance went up by 5.7%p and 2.0%p, respectively. The share of non-permanent workers joining a national pension and an employment insurance went down by 2.0%p and 1.5%p, respectively.
- The share of non-regular workers receiving severance benefits stood at 43.0%, up 0.3%p year-on-year. The share of non-regular workers receiving bonus stood at 38.5%, up 2.8%p year-on-year. The share of non-regular workers receiving overtime pay stood at 28.9%, up 1.3%p year-on-year. The share of non-regular workers taking paid leave stood at 35.9%, up 0.8%p year-on-year.
