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

Supplementary Results of the Economically Active Population Survey for the Old Population in May 2023

- \square The old population aged 55 ~ 79 totaled 15.481 million persons in May 2023, which increased by 384 thousand persons (2.5%) year-on-year.
- O The labor force participation rate stood at 60.2%, up 0.8%p year-on-year.
- O The employed persons amounted to 9.12 million persons, which rose by 349 thousand persons year-on-year. The employment-population ratio marked 58.9%, up 0.8%p year-on-year.
- O The unemployed persons amounted to 201 thousand persons, which grew by 1 thousand persons year-on-year. The unemployment rate marked 2.2%, remaining the same year-on-year.

0	The average service period of the longest serving job of males was 19 years and 1.5 months, which grew by 2.2 months year-on-year. The average service period of the longest serving job of females was 12 years and 2 months, which grew by 4.4 months year-on-year.								
0	The average age of quitting the longest serving job was 49.4 years, which went up by 0.1 year year-on-year. As for the average age of quitting the longest serving job, males and females marked 51.1 years and 47.8 years, respectively.

0	O As for the reasons for quitting a job, 'Business slump, cessation of business, layoffs or closing of establishments' occupied the largest share at 30.2%.								
	The old population aged $55 \sim 79$ with job-seeking experience for the past one year accounted for 19.8%, which went down by 0.9%p year-on-year.								
0	As for the main channels of job seeking, 'Ministry of Employment and Labor, and other public job placement agencies' occupied the largest share at 35.7%, which was followed by 'Recommendation or request of friends or relatives' (32.1%).								
	The old population with employment experience for the past one year accounted for 66.7%, which rose by 1.1%p year-on-year.								
0	O Among the old population with employment experience, 'One time' occupied the largest share at 84.8%.								
	The old population receiving a pension for the past one year occupied 50.3% (7.783 million persons), which rose by 0.9%p year-on-year. Their monthly average pension was 750 thousand won, which increased by 8.6% year-on-year.								
	The old population wanting to have a job in the future accounted for 68.5% of the old population (10.602 million persons), which remained the same year-on-year. The average maximum working age to be desired was 73 years.								
0	When selecting a future job, the largest share of males (23.3%) considered 'Wages'. The largest share of females (37.5%) considered 'Workload and working time'.								
0	As for wages to be desired, the largest share of males (25.9%) wanted to earn '3 million won or more'. The largest share of females (22.8%) wanted to earn '1.0 million won \sim less than 1.5 million won'.
