


Vital Statistics of Immigrants in 2024


In 2024, the marriages of immigrants totaled 21,450 cases, which increased by 5.0% (1,019 cases) from 2023.

- In 2024, the marriages of immigrants occupied 9.6% of the total marriages, falling by 1.0%p from 2023.
- As for immigrant marriages by type, the marriages of 'Korean husbands and foreign wives' occupied the largest share (71.2%) of the total marriages of immigrants. This figure was followed by 'Korean wives and foreign husbands' (18.2%) and 'naturalized Koreans' (10.6%).
- Compared to 2023, the share of the marriages of 'Korean husbands and foreign wives' and 'Korean wives and foreign husbands' went up by 1.4%p and 0.3%p, respectively.

< Share of the marriages of immigrants by type >




- The mean age of husbands at first marriage was 37.1 years in 2024, falling by 0.1 year from 2023. The mean age of wives at first marriage was 29.7 years in 2024, rising by 0.2 year from 2023.
- As for the share of marriages of immigrants by age gap, the marriages with husbands older than wives occupied the largest share at 76.2%. The share of the marriages with husbands 10 years older or more than wives stood at 37.3%, down 0.7%p from 2023.


< Mean age at first marriage (2023, 2024) >



< Share of the marriages by age gap between husbands and wives (2023, 2024) >




- As for the marriages of foreign or naturalized wives by nationality, Vietnam occupied the largest share at 26.8%, which was followed by China (15.9%) and Thailand (10.0%).
- Compared to 2023, the share of the marriages of Thai wives went up by 0.1%p. Whereas, the share of the marriages of Vietnamese and Chinese wives went down by 1.1%p and 1.5%p, respectively.




In 2024, the divorces of immigrants totaled 7,992 cases, dropping by 2.0% (-166 cases) from 2023.

- The divorces of immigrants occupied 8.8% of the total divorces in 2024, remaining the same as 2023.
- As for the divorces of immigrants by type, the divorces of 'Korean husbands and foreign wives' occupied the largest share (49.9%) of the total divorces of immigrants. This figure was followed by 'naturalized Koreans' (34.0%) and 'Korean wives and foreign husbands' (16.1%).
- Compared to 2023, the share of the divorces of 'Korean husbands and foreign wives' rose by 1.4%p. Whereas, the share of the divorces of 'Korean wives and foreign husbands' and 'naturalized Koreans' fell by 0.5%p and 0.8%p, respectively.

< Trends in the divorces of immigrants >




< Share of the divorces of immigrants by type >



- The mean age of husbands at divorce was 50.5 years in 2024, rising by 0.2 year from 2023. The mean age of wives at divorce was 41.2 years in 2024, falling by 0.1 year from 2023.

- As for the divorces of immigrants, the average duration of marriage before divorce recorded 10.3 years in 2024, increasing by 0.2 year compared to 2023.

< Mean age at divorce (2023, 2024) >




< Average duration of marriage before divorce (2023, 2024) >



- As for the divorces of foreign or naturalized wives by nationality, China occupied the largest share at 30.6%, which was followed by Vietnam (27.4%) and Thailand (5.0%).

- Compared to 2023, the share of the divorces of Vietnamese and Thai wives rose by 1.0%p and 0.3%p, respectively. Whereas, the share of the divorces of Chinese wives fell by 1.5%p.


< Trends in the share of divorces by nationality of wives >




In 2024, the live births of immigrants totaled 13,416 persons, rising by 10.4% (1,266 persons) from 2023.

- The live births of immigrants occupied 5.6% of the total live births in 2024, up 0.3%p from 2023.
- The live births of 'Korean fathers and foreign mothers' occupied the largest share at 61.0% of the total live births of immigrants. This share was followed by 'Korean mothers and foreign fathers' (21.9%) and 'naturalized Koreans' (17.1%).
- Compared to 2023, the share of the live births of 'Korean fathers and foreign mothers' grew by 1.7%p. Whereas, the share of the live births of 'naturalized Koreans' declined by 1.7%p.

< Trends in the live births of immigrants >




< Share of the live births of immigrants by type >



- The live births of immigrant mothers aged 30 ~ 34 occupied the largest share at 33.9%. This figure was followed by immigrant mothers aged 35 ~ 39 (28.5%) and immigrant mothers aged 25 ~ 29 (18.6%).
- The mean age of immigrant mothers at birth marked 32.5 years in 2024, falling by 0.1 year from 2023.

< Share of the live births by age of immigrant mothers (2024) >




< Mean age of immigrant mothers at birth (2023, 2024) >



- As for the live births of foreign mothers and naturalized mothers by nationality, Vietnam occupied the highest share at 30.0%, which was followed by China (12.2%) and Thailand (5.4%).
- Compared to 2023, the share of the live births of Vietnamese mothers rose by 2.7%p. Whereas, the share of the live births of Chinese and Thai mothers fell by 2.0%p and 0.4%p, respectively.

1. Purpose

- Marriage, divorce, birth and death statistics of immigrants are produced to be used as basic data when making and evaluating policies for the integration of the immigrant communities and the support for immigrant families.

2. Legal basis

- Designated statistics approved pursuant to Paragraph 4 (Vital Statistics) of Article 24-2 and Paragraph 1 of Article 17 of the Statistics Act (Approval No. 101003, Vital Statistics)

3. Basic data

- When producing vital statistics of immigrants, reports that are submitted to administrative district offices of Eup (Myeon & Dong) or Si (Gu) pursuant to the Statistics Act and the Act on Registration of Family Relations, and data of registration of family relations of the Supreme Court of Korea are used as basic data.

4. Scope

- Marriage, divorce, birth, and death events of individuals of immigrant families that include those who acquire Korean nationality through naturalization or recognition, and foreign nationals
 - The concept of an immigrant family follows Article 2 of the Multicultural Families Support Act.
 - The coverage of a family follows that of registration of family relations of the Supreme Court of Korea. Therefore, immigrants by marriage, blood-related family members and one-person immigrant families are included for statistical production.
- However, due to the incompleteness of data under the current system, foreign individuals or families made up of only foreign nationals are excluded from the statistical production of vital statistics.
 - * Death events cover ① those who acquire Korean nationality through naturalization or recognition ② foreign nationals with a Korean spouse and ③ birth-based Koreans with a family member (parent, spouse or child) who acquires Korean nationality through naturalization or recognition, or with foreign nationality.
