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

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Private Education Expenditures Survey of Elementary, Middle and High School Students in 2023

The total private education expenditures of elementary, middle and high school students recorded 27.1 trillion won in 2023, which rose by 1.2 trillion won (4.5%) from 2022.

- As for the total private education expenditures by school level, elementary school students recorded 12.4 trillion won in 2023, which rose by 4.3% from 2022. Middle school students recorded 7.2 trillion won in 2023, which rose by 1.0% from 2022. High school students recorded 7.5 trillion won in 2023, which rose by 8.2% from 2022.
 - * Change in the number of students: 5.28 million persons (2022) \rightarrow 5.21 million persons <a drop of 70 thousand persons (1.3%)>



The private education participation rate stood at 78.5% in 2023, up 0.2%p from 2022. The weekly participation hours marked 7.3 hours per student in 2023, which grew by 0.1 hour from 2022.

- As for the private education participation rate by school level, elementary school students stood at 86.0% in 2023, up 0.8%p from 2022. Middle school students stood at 75.4% in 2023, down 0.8%p from 2022. High school students stood at 66.4% in 2023, up 0.5%p from 2022.
- As for the private education participation hours by school level, elementary school students marked 7.5 hours in 2023, rising by 0.1 hour from 2022. Middle school students marked 7.4 hours in 2023, falling by 0.1 hour from 2022. High school students marked 6.7 hours in 2023, rising by 0.1 hour from 2022.

The average monthly private education expenditures per student recorded 434 thousand won in 2023, rising by 5.8% from 2022. The average monthly private education expenditures per participation student recorded 553 thousand won in 2023, rising by 5.5% from 2022.


The average monthly private education expenditures per elementary school student recorded 398 thousand won (25 thousand won, 6.8%). The average monthly private education expenditures per middle school student recorded 449 thousand won (12 thousand won, 2.6%). The average monthly private education expenditures per high school student recorded 491 thousand won (32 thousand won, 6.9%).

* General subjects: 326 thousand won <a rise of 16 thousand won $(5.3\%^{\uparrow})$ >, Artistic & physical skills, hobbies and culture: 105 thousand won <a rise of 7 thousand won $(7.1\%^{\uparrow})$ >

O (Participation students)

The average monthly private education expenditures per elementary school participation student marked 462 thousand won (25 thousand won, $5.7\% \uparrow$). The average monthly private education expenditures per middle school participation student marked 596 thousand won (21 thousand won, $3.7\% \uparrow$). The average monthly private education expenditures per high school participation student marked 740 thousand won (43 thousand won, $6.1\% \uparrow$).

* General subjects: 518 thousand won <a rise of 28 thousand won (5.7%↑)>, Artistic & physical skills, hobbies and culture: 226 thousand won <a rise of 10 thousand won (4.7%↑)>



The average monthly private education expenditures on general subjects amounted to 326 thousand won per student in 2023, rising by 5.3% from 2022. The average monthly private education expenditures on general subjects amounted to 518 thousand won per participation student in 2023, rising by 5.7% from 2022.

○ (Total students)

The average monthly private education expenditures on English recorded the highest figure of 128 thousand won per student, which was followed by mathematics (122 thousand won), Korean (38 thousand won) and 'Social studies and science' (19 thousand won).

- Compared to 2022, the average monthly private education expenditures on Korean (11.1%), 'Social studies and science' (8.2%), mathematics (5.6%) and English (3.8%) recorded an increase.

(Participation students)

The average monthly private education expenditures on English recorded the highest figure of 248 thousand won per participation student, which was followed by mathematics (233 thousand won), Korean (148 thousand won) and 'Social studies and science' (137 thousand won).

- Compared to 2022, the average monthly private education expenditures on Korean (8.2%), 'Social studies and science' (7.4%), mathematics (5.9%) and English (5.0%) recorded an increase.

The higher household income level, the higher education expenditures.

- As for the average monthly private education expenditures, the households earning 8 million won or more recorded the highest figure of 671 thousand won per student. Whereas, the households earning less than 3 million won recorded 183 thousand won per student.
- Compared to 2022, the average monthly private education expenditures of the households earning 8 million won or more rose by 3.5%. The average monthly private education expenditures of the households earning less than 3 million won rose by 3.0%.

'Dual income households' recorded the highest private education expenditures.

- The average monthly private education expenditures of 'Dual income households' recorded 459 thousand won per student, going up by 6.2% from 2022.
 - The average monthly expenditures of 'Single income households by fathers' and 'Single income households by mothers' recorded 429 thousand won and 288 thousand won, respectively.

As for the average monthly private education expenditures, the share of students spending 700 thousand won or more stood at 22%, up 2.9%p from 2022.

As for the average monthly private education expenditures, the share of students spending less than 600 thousand won showed a year-on-year decrease. Whereas, the share of students spending 600 thousand won or more showed a year-on-year increase.

As for the private education of general subjects by purpose, 'Makeup for classes' occupied the highest share. As for the private education of artistic and physical skills by purpose, 'Hobbies, culture and development of talent' occupied the highest share.

- As for the purposes of general subjects, 'Makeup for classes' occupied the highest share at 49.6%, which was followed by 'Study in advance' (24.0%) and 'Preparation for higher school level' (14.2%). Compared to 2022, 'Child care' went up by 0.7%p. Whereas, 'Makeup for classes' and 'Anxiety' recorded a decrease.
- As for the purposes of artistic and physical skills, 'Hobbies, culture and development of talent' occupied the highest share at 63.0%. Compared to 2022, 'Child care' went up by 0.9%p. Whereas, 'Hobbies, culture and development of talent' and 'Makeup for classes' recorded a decrease.

The after-school program participation rate stood at 41.0%. The percentage of students purchasing EBS textbooks stood at 16.1%. The language course participation rate stood at 0.5%.

Compared to 2022, the after-school program participation rate went up by 4.8%p. The percentage of students purchasing EBS textbooks went down by 0.3%p. The language course participation rate went up by 0.3%p.

I . Private Education Expenditures of Elementary, Middle and High School Students

1. Total private education expenditures


The total private education expenditures of elementary, middle and high school students recorded 27.1 trillion won in 2023, rising by 4.5% from 2022.

- The total private education expenditures of elementary, middle and high school students recorded 27.1 trillion won in 2023, rising by 1.2 trillion won (4.5%) from 26 trillion won in 2022.
 - The private education expenditures of elementary school students recorded 12.4 trillion won in 2023, rising by 4.3% from 2022. The private education expenditures of middle school students recorded 7.2 trillion won in 2023, rising by 1.0% from 2022. The private education expenditures of high school students recorded 7.5 trillion won in 2023, rising by 8.2% from 2022.
- In 2023, the total number of elementary, middle and high school students was 5.21 million persons, which fell by 70 thousand persons (-1.3%) from 2022.

2. Private education participation rate and weekly participation hours


The private education participation rate of elementary, middle and high school students stood at 78.5% in 2023, up 0.2%p from 2022. The weekly participation hours recorded 7.3 hours per student in 2023, which grew by 0.1 hour from 2022.

- The participation rate of elementary school students recorded the highest figure at 86.0%, which was followed by middle school students (75.4%) and high school students (66.4%).
- Compared to 2022, the participation rate of elementary and high school students went up by 0.8%p and 0.5%p, respectively. The participation rate of middle school students went down by 0.8%p.
- The weekly participation hours of elementary school students recorded the highest figure of 7.5 hours, which was followed by middle school students (7.4 hours) and high school students (6.7 hours).
 - Compared to 2022, the weekly participation hours of elementary and high school students went up by 0.1 hour and 0.1 hour, respectively. The weekly participation hours of middle school students went down by 0.1 hour.

3. Average monthly private education expenditures per student


The average monthly private education expenditures per student recorded 434 thousand won in 2023, rising by 5.8% from 2022. The average monthly private education expenditures per participation student recorded 553 thousand won in 2023, rising by 5.5% from 2022.

- The average monthly private education expenditures recorded 491 thousand won per high school student, 449 thousand won per middle school student and 398 thousand won per elementary school student. Compared to 2022, the average monthly expenditures of high school students showed the highest increase of 6.9%, which was followed by elementary school students (6.8%) and middle school students (2.6%).
- The average monthly private education expenditures recorded 740 thousand won per high school participation student, 596 thousand won per middle school participation student and 462 thousand won per elementary school participation student. Compared to 2022, the average monthly expenditures of high school students showed the highest increase of 6.1%, which was followed by elementary school students (5.7%) and middle school students (3.7%).

As for the average monthly private education expenditures by grade, 1st grade high school students marked the highest figure of 515 thousand won per student. 2nd grade high school students marked the highest figure of 745 thousand won per participation student.

- As for the average monthly private education expenditures per student by grade, 3rd and 4th grade elementary school students recorded the highest figure of 432 thousand won. 2nd grade middle school students recorded the highest figure of 453 thousand won. 1st grade high school students recorded the highest figure of 515 thousand won.
 - Compared to 2022, 6th grade elementary school students showed a decrease in the average monthly private education expenditures. The other grade elementary school students, and all grade middle and high school students showed an increase in the average monthly private education expenditures.
- As for the average monthly private education expenditures per participation student by grade, 4th grade elementary school students recorded the highest figure of 496 thousand won. 3rd grade middle school students recorded the highest figure of 615 thousand won. 2nd grade high school students recorded the highest figure of 745 thousand won.
- Compared to 2022, 6th grade elementary school participation students showed a decrease in the average monthly private education expenditures. The other grade elementary school participation students, and all grade middle and high school participation students showed an increase in the average monthly private education expenditures.

4. Average monthly private education expenditures per student by subject

The average monthly private education expenditures on general subjects amounted to 326 thousand won per student in 2023, going up by 5.3% from 2022. The average monthly private education expenditures on general subjects amounted to 518 thousand won per participation student in 2023, rising by 5.7% from 2022.

- As for the average monthly private education expenditures on general subjects, English recorded the highest figure of 128 thousand won per student, which was followed by mathematics (122 thousand won), Korean (38 thousand won) and 'Social studies and science' (19 thousand won).
 - Compared to 2022, the average monthly private education expenditures on Korean (11.1%), 'Social studies and science' (8.2%), mathematics (5.6%) and English (3.8%) recorded an increase.
 - As for the average monthly private education expenditures on general subjects by grade, 5th grade elementary school students spent the highest expenditures on English (131 thousand won). 3rd grade middle school students spent the highest expenditures on mathematics (174 thousand won). 1st grade high school students spent the highest expenditures on mathematics (194 thousand won).
- As for the average monthly private education expenditures on general subjects, English recorded the highest figure of 248 thousand won per participation student, which was followed by mathematics (233 thousand won), Korean (148 thousand won) and 'Social studies and science' (137 thousand won).
 - Compared to 2022, the average monthly private education expenditures on Korean (8.2%), 'Social studies and science' (7.4%), mathematics (5.9%) and English (5.0%) recorded an increase.
 - As for the average monthly private education expenditures on general subjects by grade, 5th grade elementary school participation students spent the highest expenditures on English (221 thousand won). 3rd grade middle school participation students spent the highest expenditures on mathematics (294 thousand won). 2nd and 3rd grade high school participation students spent the highest expenditures on mathematics (367 thousand won).



5. Average monthly private education expenditures per student by type

As for the private education expenditures on general subjects and 'Artistic and physical skills' of the total students, 'Taking lessons at private academic institutes' recorded the highest figure. As for the private education expenditures on general subjects of participation students, 'Taking lessons at private academic institutes' recorded the highest figure. As for the private education expenditures on 'Artistic & physical skills' of participation students, 'One-on-one tutoring' recorded the highest figure.

- As for general subjects, the average monthly expenditures on 'Taking lessons at private academic institutes' recorded the highest figure of 241 thousand won per student, which was followed by 'One-on-one tutoring' (37 thousand won), 'Group tutoring' (22 thousand won) and 'Internet & correspondence lectures, etc.' (16 thousand won).
 - Compared to 2022, the average monthly private education expenditures on 'Taking lessons at private academic institutes' (8.9%) and 'Internet & correspondence lectures, etc.' (7.0%) recorded an increase. Whereas, 'Group tutoring' (-6.9%), 'Textbooks with tutor's visit' (-5.7%) and 'One-on-one tutoring' (-5.3%) recorded a decrease.
- As for general subjects, the average monthly expenditures on 'Taking lessons at private academic institutes' recorded the highest figure of 496 thousand won per participation student, which was followed by 'One-on-one tutoring' (412 thousand won), 'Group tutoring' (293 thousand won) and 'Internet & correspondence lectures, etc.' (141 thousand won).
 - Compared to 2022, the average monthly private education expenditures on 'Taking lessons at private academic institutes' (7.5%), 'Group tutoring' (5.8%), 'One-on-one tutoring' (5.0%), 'Textbooks with tutor's visit' (4.7%) and 'Internet & correspondence lectures, etc.' (4.2%) recorded an increase.

The higher household income level, the higher education expenditures and the participation rate.


- The average monthly private education expenditures of households earning 8 million won and over marked 671 thousand won, which rose by 3.5% from 2022. The average monthly private education expenditures of households earning less than 3 million won marked 183 thousand won, which rose by 3.0% from 2022.
- The participation rate of households earning 8 million won and over stood at 87.9%, down 0.3%p from 2022. The participation rate of households earning less than 3 million won stood at 57.2%, down 0.1%p from 2022.

'Dual income households' recorded the highest private education expenditures and the highest participation rate.


- The average monthly private education expenditures of 'Dual income households' recorded 459 thousand won per student, going up by 6.2% from 2022.
 - The average monthly expenditures of 'Single income households by fathers' and 'Single income households by mothers' recorded 429 thousand won and 288 thousand won, respectively.
- The private education participation rate of 'Dual income households' stood at 80.6%, up 0.4%p from 2022.
 - The private education participation rate of 'Single income households by fathers' and 'Single income households by mothers' stood at 78.8% and 65.4%, respectively.

8. Private education expenditures and participation rate by the number of children

As for the average monthly private education expenditures and the participation rate, the households with 1 child showed the highest figure.

- The average monthly private education expenditures of households with 1 child showed the highest figure of 486 thousand won per student, which was followed by those with 2 children (456 thousand won per student) and those with 3 children or more (334 thousand won per student).
- The participation rate of households with 1 child showed the highest figure of 82.0%, which was followed by those with 2 children (80.6%) and those with 3 children or more (70.2%).

9. Private education expenditures and participation rate of high school students by school performance

The higher school performance, the higher average monthly private education expenditures and the participation rate.

- The average monthly private education expenditures of students recording 'Within top 10%' of school performance amounted to 616 thousand won, rising by 4.3% from 2022. On the other hand, the average monthly expenditures of students recording 'Within bottom 20%' of school performance amounted to 336 thousand won, rising by 4.2% from 2022.
- The participation rate of students recording 'Within top 10%' of school performance stood at 76.1%, down 1.5%p from 2022. In the meantime, the participation rate of students recording 'Within bottom 20%' of school performance stood at 53.9%, down 0.1%p from 2022.

10. Private education expenditures and participation rate by area

Among 4 areas, Seoul showed the highest figure of private education expenditures for the total students and the participation students.

- As for the average monthly private education expenditures per student by area, Seoul marked the highest figure, which was followed by metropolitan cities, cities and 'Eup & Myeon'.
 - Compared to 2022, all 4 areas of metropolitan cities (7.9%), cities (6.0%), Seoul (5.3%) and 'Eup & Myeon' (2.2%) recorded a rise in private education expenditures per student.
- As for the average monthly private education expenditures per participation student by area, Seoul marked the highest figure, which was followed by metropolitan cities, cities and 'Eup & Myeon'.
 - Compared to 2022, all 4 areas of metropolitan cities (7.3%), cities (5.6%), Seoul (4.8%) and 'Eup & Myeon' (3.2%) recorded a rise in private education expenditures per participation student.








